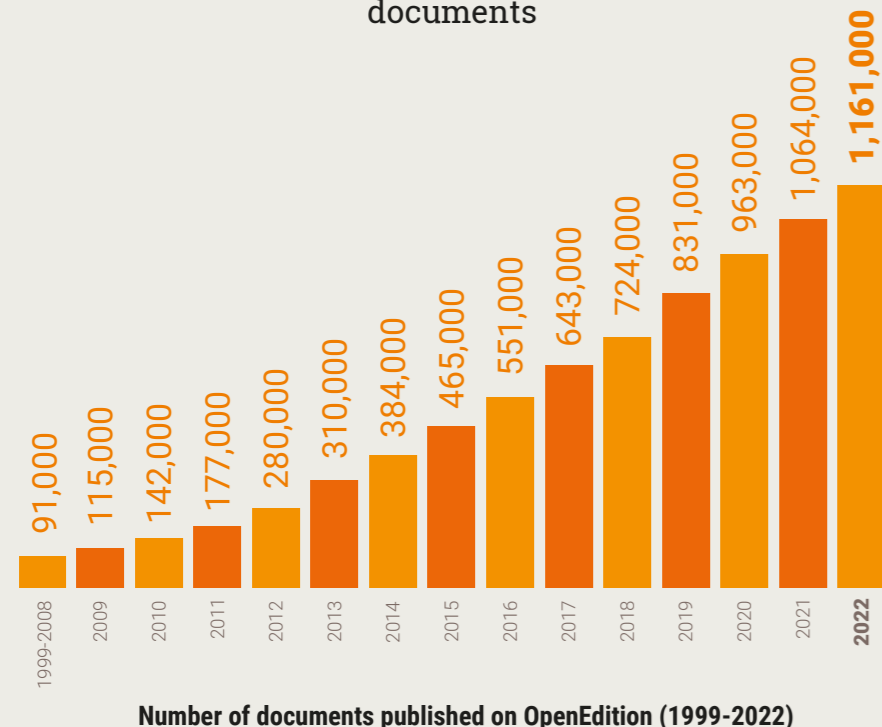

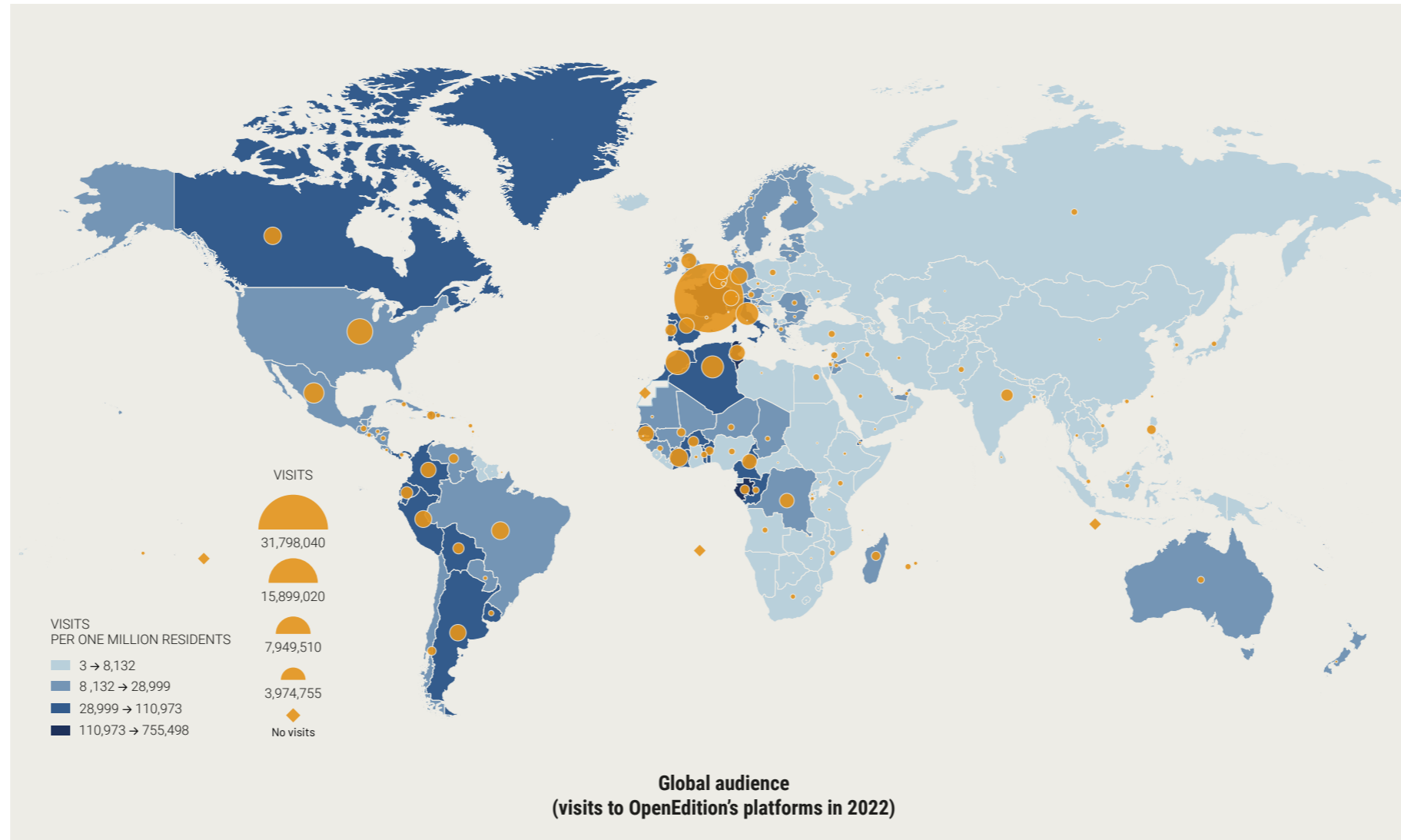

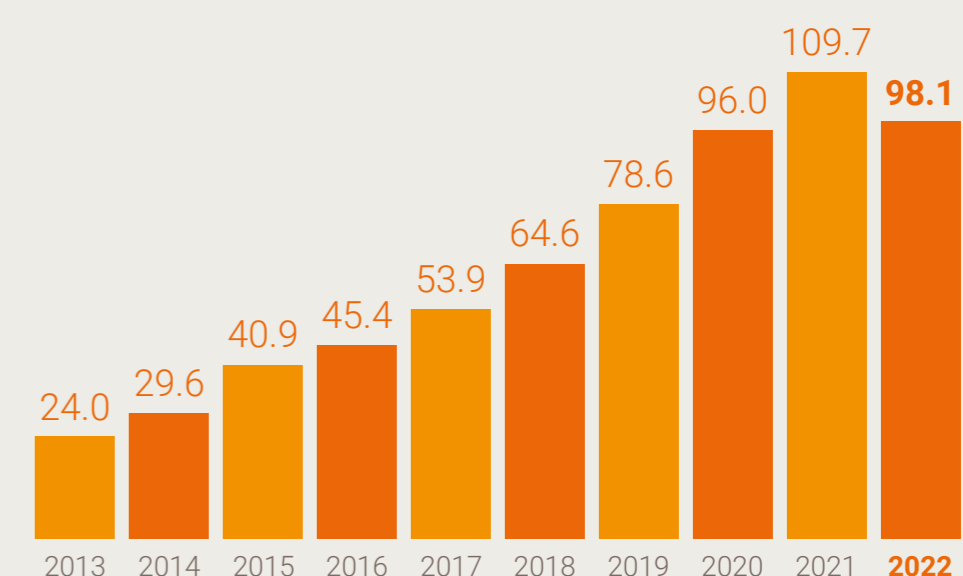
Number of documents published on OpenEdition (1999-2022)

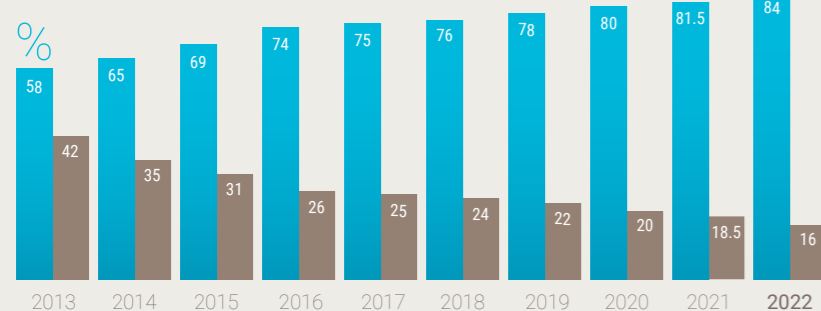

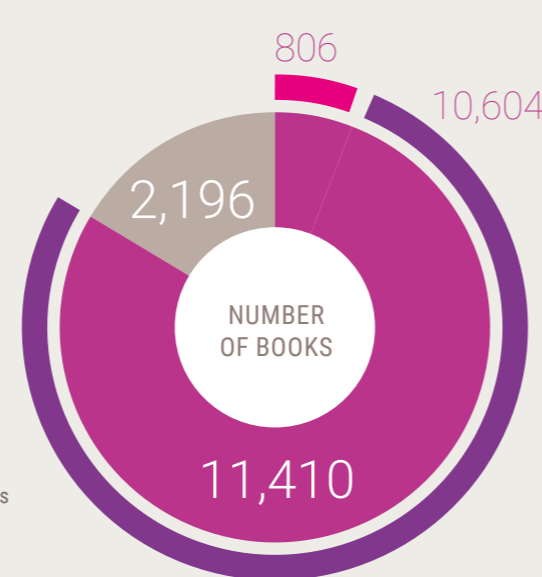

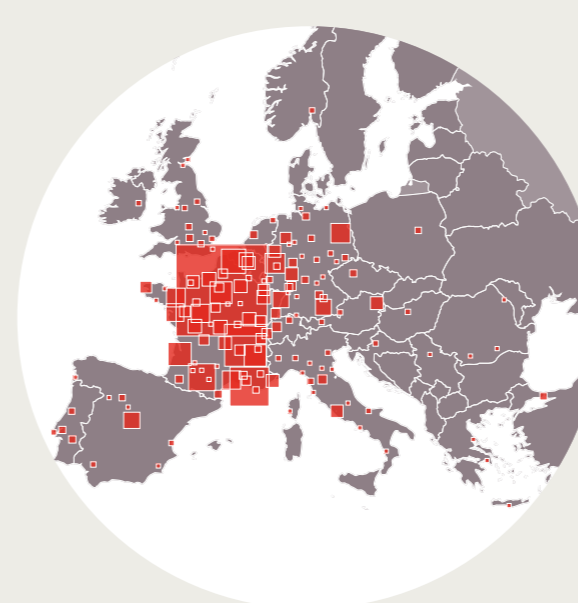

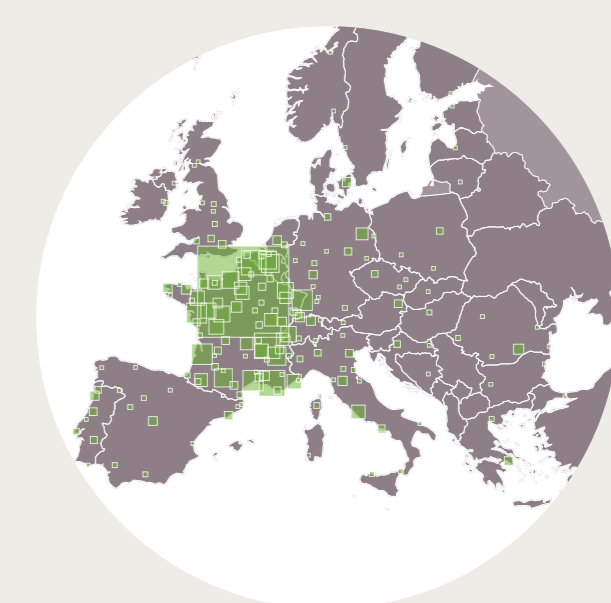
