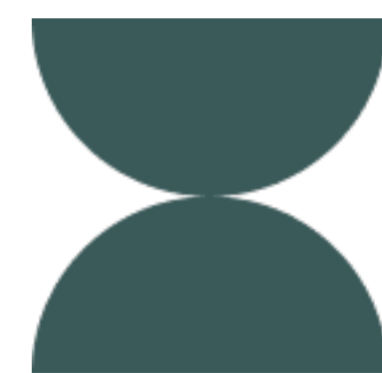
Led by an international Editorial Board

Available in multiple languages

The Toolkit is currently available to browse and download in English and French. The longer-term goal is to translate the text into other United Nations languages, to further enhance its reach and impact.



Supports the global open access community

The Toolkit's content was crafted to support open access stakeholders across different regions, including publishers, editors, authors, technical providers, reviewers, researchers and librarians.

The Toolkit covers topics across the journal development lifecycle and everyday operation. It includes helpful references as well as links to trusted external resources with further information and guidance.
